

- 1 **STAND**: The Priest and the faithful, sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross, while the Priest, facing the people, says: ♥ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- 2 The Priest, extending his hands, greets the faithful, saying: The Lord be with you The faithful reply: And with your spirit
- The Priest invites the faithful to make the Penitential Act:


Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries A brief pause for silence follows. Then all recite together the formula of general confession: I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, And, striking their breast, they say: through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; Then they continue: therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God. The absolution by The Priest follows: May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life The faithful reply: Amen

Then, when it is prescribed, this hymn is either sung or said:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,

with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

5 A brief pause for silence follows. The Priest, then prays the Opening Prayer. Upon conclusion the faithful reply: Amen. SIT



TODAY'S READINGS FROM THE BIBLE FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES From the New Testament, Book of Acts 14:21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN From the New Testament, John 13: 31-33a, 34-35

When Judas had left them, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and God will glorify him at once. My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

The Deacon, or the Priest, says: The Gospel of the Lord The faithful reply: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ Then, all SIT.

7 RITE OF CONFIRMATION

The Pastor will present the candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation to Bishop Fabre.

Bishop Fabre will give a homily and so lead the candidates, their sponsors and parents, and the whole assembly to a deeper understanding of the mystery of Confirmation.

After the homily, Bishop will ask the candidates to stand as he questions them. After each question, they respond in unison: I do.

The Bishop confirms their profession of faith by proclaiming the 10 All SIT. The Altar is prepared. All offer tithings. faith of the Church. Then Bishop will extend his hands over the candidates and say:

Bishop will now anoint each candidate with the Sacred Chrism Oil. Bishop Fabre, calling them by the name that they have chosen, says: Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit The newly confirmed responds: Amen

All **STAND** and profess the Profession of Faith: 8

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. All bow their head For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. All lift their head For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory

to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. 11 The Priest, standing at the Altar, takes the Paten with the Sacred Bread and holds it slightly raised above the Altar with both hands, saying in a low voice:

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you:

fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life. If said aloud, the faithful reply: Blessed be God forever

12 The Priest then takes the Chalice and holds it slightly raised above the Altar with both hands, saying in a low voice:

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink.

If said aloud, the faithful reply: Blessed be God forever

13 All **STAND**. Extending his hands, the Priest says:

Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father The faithful reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church

- 14 The Priest, with hands extended, says the Prayer over the Offerings, at the end of which the people acclaim: Amen
- 15 The Priest says: The Lord be with you The faithful reply: And with your spirit The Priest, raising his hands, continues: Lift up your hearts The faithful: We lift them up to the Lord The Priest adds: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God The faithful: It is right and just The Priest, with hands extended, continues the Preface

16 At the end of the Preface he joins his hands and concludes the 25 The Priest and faithful together sing or say aloud: Preface with the faithful, singing or saying aloud: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Then, all KNEEL

17 Mass continues as usual as the Priest prays the first half of the Eucharistic Prayer, including the words of Consecration.

- 18 The Priest, with hands extended, says: The mystery of faith The faithful may reply: When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again
- 19 Mass continues as usual as the Priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer, concluding with the great Amen.
- 20 Then, all **STAND**. The Priest and faithful together say: Our Father ...
- 21 With hands extended, the Priest alone continues, saying: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ

22 The faithful conclude the prayer, acclaiming: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever

- 23 The Priest, with hands extended, says: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you; look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. He joins his hands. Who live and reign for ever and ever The faithful reply: Amen
- 24 The Priest: The peace of the Lord be with you always The faithful reply: And with your spirit Then, the Deacon, or the Priest, adds: Let us offer each other the sign of peace

BISHOP SHELTON J. FABRE Who is he and what is he wearing?

BISHOP | The Bishop is a successor to the Apostles, placed in a Catholic diocese by the pope to shepherd its people. The Bishop of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux is The Most Reverend Shelton J. Fabre.

MITRE | The hat that the Bishop wears is called a mitre. It is reminiscent of the High Priest's garb in the Old Testament. All of the High Priests (Bishops) wear them, to single out their position as servant of the diocese and Mother Church. The two points at the top (front and back) represent the Old and New Testament.

CROSIER | The staff that the Bishop carries is called a crosier. It is a staff that is usually seen in the hands of a shepherd, which is exactly what the Bishop is for our diocese.


PECTORAL CROSS | The large cross that the Bishop wears around hisneck is a symbol of his priesthood. At his ordination he promised to "always conform his life to the mystery of the Lord's cross".

ZUCHETTO | The zuchetto is the skull cap that the Bishop wears. He wears it to symbolize our connection to our Jewish heritage. Bishop will remove his zucchetto at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer and will not place it on again until the Blessed Sacrament is placed back into the Tabernacle as a sign of reverence and humility for the Presence of the Lord.
